



HealthFacts RI is Rhode Island's **All Payer Claims Database** (APCD), a database that collects de-identified healthcare claims, enrollment, and provider data from Medicare, Medicaid, and the largest commercial health insurers in the state. HealthFacts RI can help users:

- Identify areas for improvement, growth, and success across the healthcare system.
- Understand and quantify health system performance and healthcare transformation.
- Provide meaningful comparisons and actionable data and reports to help inform policy and consumer decisions.

Who can use APCD Data?

Providers

Make risk-adjusted peer comparisons for practice improvement and transformation Assess referral patterns

State Agencies

- Measure population health trends
- Evaluate healthcare reform efforts
- Increase price transparency

Researchers

- Evaluate program effectiveness
- Identify healthcare cost drivers
- Track the prevalence of specific disease

Health Systems and Insurers

- Assess market share
- Evaluate interventions
- Develop predictive modeling methodologies

What questions can HealthFacts RI help answer?

- Can patient-centered medical homes reduce ED and inpatient use and improve quality of care?
- What causes nursing home admissions for at-risk seniors? How can we reduce risk factors and keep our seniors in the community?
- Will changes in Medicaid provider payment rates impact Medicaid beneficiaries' access to care?
- What is the financial burden of chronic health conditions in the community, and how can we improve services for people with chronic health conditions?
- What is the cost difference for certain healthcare services between Rhode Island and other states?
- Which providers appear to be over-prescribing antibiotics?
