CONSENT ORDER


This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation, Board of Examiners in Embalming (hereinafter "Board"), upon information that Kevin Reilly (hereinafter "Respondent") did, on 20 May 1996, plead guilty in U.S. District Court for the District of Rhode Island to a single count indictment charging possession with intent to distribute cocaine base in violation of 21 U.S.C. Section 841 (a) (i). Based upon this information the Board, at its meetings held on 28 October 1996 and 8 November 1996, voted that the Funeral Director/Embalmer license issued to Respondent be revoked and that Respondent not be permitted to apply for reinstatement of same for a period of at least two (2) years. Prior to initiating administrative action to impose the aforementioned disciplinary action, it was agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. That Respondent's license as a Funeral Director/Embalmer shall be revoked and Respondent shall not apply for reinstatement of said license for a period of at least one (1) year.
2. That said revocation shall become effective upon the execution of this Consent Order by all the parties.



3. That should Respondent apply to the Board for reinstatement of his license as a Funeral Director/Embalmer after the expiration of at least one (1) year from the date of this Order and, should the Board grant said request, Respondent shall serve a probationary period of at least four (4) years duration upon such terms and conditions as the Board at the time of reinstatement deems appropriate.
4. That should the Board grant Respondent request for reinstatement of his Funeral Director/Embalmer license after the expiration of at least one (1) year from the date of the revocation thereof, Respondent shall not be required to meet requirements for initial licensure contained in Section 5-33.2-6(1-9), rather, the provisions of Section 5-33.2-6(10) will be deemed to apply to Respondent.
5. That during the period of time Respondent's license is revoked, should he engage in an act which constitutes the embalming and/or funeral directing as those terms are defined in Chapter 5-33.2, or any act which constitutes grounds to revoke said license as set forth in Section 5-33.2-17, his license as a Funeral Director/Embalmer shall be revoked permanently.
6. That the terms of this Consent Order shall become effective upon signing by both parties.
7. That this Consent Order constitutes a final disposition

of the matters forming the basis for this Agreement and obviates the necessity for an Administrative Hearing.
