CONSENT ORDER


This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation, Board of Examiners in Embalming (hereinafter "Board"), upon a request submitted by Kevin G. Reilly (hereinafter "Respondent") that his license as a Funeral Director/Embalmer be reinstated. After review and consideration of this matter, the Board, at its meetings held 15 December 1997 and 12 January 1998, voted that the Funeral Director/Embalmer license be issued to Kevin G. Reilly, reinstated subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. That said reinstatement shall become effective upon the execution of this Consent Order by all the parties.
2. That Respondent shall serve a probationary period of at least four (4) years duration upon such terms and conditions as delineated in this Consent Order.
3. That said probationary period shall commence effective upon the execution of this Consent Order by all the parties and shall abate for any period of time Respondent is not engaged with the practice of Funeral Director/Embalming.

4. That during the period of probation, Respondent shall notify the Board forthwith in the event he is charged with any crime by any law enforcement agency in any jurisdiction. The Board reserves the right to take appropriate licensure action should Respondent be charged with a crime in any jurisdiction and /or should Respondent violate the terms of his probation with the court.
5. That during the period of probation, Respondent shall meet with the Board, to report on his activities and employment, at least one (1) time per year or more frequently if deemed appropriate by the Board.
6. That during the period of probation, it shall be the responsibility of the Respondent to assure that the employer of Respondent submit written reports to the Board quarterly (January 1, June 1, September 1 and December 1,) with respect to professional practice and employment of the Respondent.
7. That during the period of probation, the Respondent shall be available to make three presentations (one per year), on Ethics in Funeral Service at an accredited school of Funeral Service Education during the second, third and fourth years of probation. The Respondent shall contact the Board prior to scheduling these presentations.
8. That during the period of probation, the Respondent shall limit all licensed activities relating to the profession to the two locations of the current employer (Russell J. Boyle & Son, 331 Smith Street, Providence, RI and 142 Centerville Road, Warwick, RI). Should

Respondent change employment during the course of probation, the Respondent must notify the Board forthwith of said change including the name and address of the new employer and the reason for the change in employment. That Respondent shall limit all licensed activities relating to the profession to his new employer.

9. That during the period of probation, should Respondent violate any terms of the Consent Order, the provisions of Chapter 5-33.2 of the General Laws or The Rules and Regulations relating to Funeral Director/Embalmer, his license as a Funeral Director/Embalmer shall be revoked permanently.
10. That should Respondent comply with the terms of this Consent Order, the provisions of Chapter 5-33.2 of the General Laws and The Rules and Regulations relating to Funeral Director/Embalmer, he may apply for an unrestricted license at the expiration of the probationary period.
11. That this Consent Order constitutes a final disposition of the matters forming the basis for this Order and obviates the necessity for an Administrative Hearing.


