**INTERIM CONSENT ORDER**


THIS MATTER is before the Department of Health, Board of Medical Licensure and Discipline (the "Board") pursuant to R.I.G.L. §5-37-5.2 upon the receipt of a notification of a complaint that came to a local police department regarding Philip McAndrew, M.D. (the "Respondent"). The complaint alleges serious issues of substance abuse. The Board of Medical Licensure and Discipline undertook an investigation of the facts and circumstances surrounding the complaint.

The Board finds that there is probable cause to believe that the allegations regarding the Respondent have merit. However, given the fact that there are issues pending before other tribunals, the Board accepts the Respondent's Voluntary Surrender of his license to practice medicine in Rhode Island or any other jurisdiction until further Order of the Board. Additionally, Respondent also agrees to undergoes a forensic medical evaluation for substance abuse.

1. The Respondent agrees to be seen evaluators at either the Farley Center at Williamsberg Place or the Marworth Center and/or any health care provider whom the Committee or the Board shall require. Respondent waives any right to confidentiality and understands that the Board will communicate with the evaluators in order to insure that the issues of which it is aware become part of the evaluation.
2. The Respondent shall obtain appropriate medical coverage for his patient care responsibilities.

3. The Respondent shall continue to be responsible for the timely transfer of records to the patients provider of choice in accordance with the Rules and Regulation for the Licensing and Discipline of Physicians (R5-37-MD/DO).
4. All reports from providers regarding the Respondent shall be sent directly to the Board, the Committee and the Respondent simultaneously.

I hereby agree to abide by the terms of this Agreement and the Contract with the Committee.
