CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws Chapter 5-35 (2004 Reenactment) and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder, the Department of Health, Board of Opticianry (hereinafter "Department") has investigated a complaint charging Brian J. Greene (hereinafter "Respondent"), with a violation of Chapter 5-35 of the Rhode Island General Laws..

After consideration by the Department, the following constitutes the Findings of Fact with respect to the professional performance of the Respondent:


1. Respondent is an optician licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island.
2. On or about May 1, 2007 the Department received information from Family Eye Care Services, Pawtucket, Rhode Island which clearly reflected the Respondent had falsified and forged his license as an optician for the period expiring February 1, 2008. The Department's records do reflect the Respondent's license as an optician had expired on January 31, 2004 and that at no point did the Department issue a renewed license for the period February 1, 2004 through January 31, 2008. During said period Respondent's license was expired, Respondent was employed as an optician for Family Eye Care Services.

The parties agree as follows:

1. Respondent is an optician licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island.
2. Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Department and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Department.
3. Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands that it is a proposal of the Department and is subject to the final approval by the Department. This Consent Order and the contents

thereof are not binding on Respondent until final approval by the Department.

4. Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
 - a) The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Department;
 - b) The right to produce witnesses and present evidence in his behalf at a hearing;
 - c) The right to cross-examine witnesses;
 - d) The right to have subpoenas issued by the Department;
 - e) The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
 - f) Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order;
 - g) Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Department for consideration and review;
 - h) Any objection to the fact that it will be necessary for the Department to become acquainted with all evidence pertaining to this matter in order to adequately review this Consent Order;
 - i) Any objection to the fact that potential bias against the Respondent may occur as a result of the presentation of this Consent Order to the Department.
5. This Consent Order shall become part of the public record of this proceeding once it is accepted by all parties.
6. Respondent admits the allegations contained above.
7. Respondent agrees to a suspension of his license as an optician for a period of six (6) months retroactive to May 1, 2007.
8. Following the suspension period the Respondent may reapply for his license subject to Board approval.
