ORDER

Pursuant to Section 5-19.1 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder, the Department of Health (hereinafter "Department"), after review and consultation with the Board of Pharmacy (hereinafter "Board") has investigated a complaint charging James Enos (hereinafter "Respondent") with violation of Chapter 5-19.1 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island.

After consideration by the Department Board, the following constitutes the Findings of Fact with respect to the professional performance of the Respondent:


1. Respondent is a pharmacist licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island.
2. That on or about October 6, 2009 you were sentenced to serve eighteen months of a twenty year sentence at the Adult Correctional Institution following a jury trial in July 2009 at which time you were found guilty and convicted of felony domestic assault with a deadly weapon.
3. That the conduct described in paragraph two (2) above constitutes unprofessional conduct as defined in Section 5-19.1-21 and, as such, is grounds to suspend your license.

Based upon the foregoing, the Department hereby enters the following Order:

1. That the pharmacist license issued to the Respondent is hereby suspended for a period of two years effective October 21, 2009.

2. That this Order shall remain in full force and effect pending further Order of the Board.
