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
# RHODE ISLAND VIOLENT DEATH REPORTING SYSTEM (RIVDRS), 2004-2019

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#### BACKGROUND

- ☐ The National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS) sponsored by the CDC, is a state-based violent death surveillance system conducted by health departments in 50 states. Rhode Island has participated in NVDRS since 2003 with data collection beginning in 2004.
- ☐ The goals of RIVDRS are to collect timely, accurate, and comprehensive surveillance data on all violent deaths using web-based data entry system and guidelines provided by the CDC, and to disseminate data to the public and stakeholders to develop prevention strategies and reduce violent deaths in their communities (Figure 1).


### DATA ELEMENTS

#### ☐ RIVDRS Details

- **✓** Demographic characteristics
- ✓ Mechanisms of injury
- **✓** Location of death
- ✓ Toxicology Information
- ✓ Mental and physical health
- ✓ Interpersonal relationships
- ✓ Sexual preference
- ☐ The data are collected and stored in a nested manner. Analyses and data linking must consider this three-level hierarchy structure (Figure 2).
- □ RIVDRS data can be analyzed on the incident, the victim or the suspect level.
