# STATEWIDE SUMMARY OF IMMUNIZATION RATES & LEAD EXPOSURE RATES FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS

## Immunization

The Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) administered a web-based immunization reporting survey to all school nurses to assess immunization compliance for students enrolled in Kindergarten and Grade 7. The Survey allows the Rhode Island Immunization Program to more accurately depict not only statewide childhood immunization rates, but to also develop more specific data about our communities, our neighborhoods, and our varied populations.

All students entering kindergarten and seventh grade must have documentation of certain immunizations. Schools with kindergarteners and seventh grade students were required to report their immunization coverage rates to RIDOH. This statewide summary includes information on how many schools in each district reported to RIDOH, and information on the immunization coverage rates of students in each school and district

## Lead

Rhode Island healthcare providers must screen their patients between nine and 12 months of age, and they should get their second screening by 36 months of age. There must be at least 12 months between the first and second test.

RIDOH recommends that after compliance is met with the first 2 screens that a child is screened annually until the age of 6 if a risk for lead poisoning is indicated on the Risk Assessment Questionnaire.

All children entering Kindergarten should be compliant with lead testing requirements. The measure of elevated lead levels is five micrograms of lead per deciliter of blood (ug/dL) or higher.


The statewide maps below show, at the census tract level, factors associated with risk for lead exposure and poor asthma control.




## HOUSING BUILT BEFORE 1950




## CHILDREN 2 TO 17 WITH ASTHMA, 2010-2012




## MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME, 2008-2012






### Kindergarten Lead Screening Status\*

Lead exposure can lead to cognitive and developmental delays, which can affect a child's performance in the classroom. All Rhode Island healthcare providers are required by law to screen their patients for lead poisoning twice by 36 months of age. 

Lead hazards in the home are the most common sources of lead poisoning. Children in low-income families in Rhode Island are more likely than other children to live in older housing, where these hazards are more prevalent.

\*\*\* Students were only counted in the 0-4  $\mu\text{dL}$  category when they were also compliant with screening requirements because HEALTH estimates that 5% of children who screen between 0-4  $\mu\text{dL}$  at their first screening have elevated blood lead levels at the second screening.

Data Sources: The Rhode Island Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program's Lead Elimination Surveillance System (LESS) and KIDSNET, Rhode Island's web-based, integrated child health information system were linked with Rhode Island Department of Education (RIDE) Enrollment Data, SY2014-2015, by The Providence Plan. 10% of RIDE Kindergarten students did not match to KIDSNET data and were excluded from the total # of students.
