**CONSENT ORDER FOR VOLUNTARY SURRENDER**

Pursuant to R. I. Gen. Laws §§ 23-4.1-1 *et seq.*, Emergency Medical Transportation Services, and 216-RICR-20-10-2, Emergency Medical Services, the Rhode Island Department of Health, Division of Preparedness, Response, Infectious Disease and Emergency Medical Services, Center for Emergency Medical Services ("RIDOH") has investigated Complaint No. C22-0614 charging Monique Wilmar, EMT License Number 14104, ("Respondent"), with unprofessional conduct. After review and consideration by RIDOH the following are and shall constitute

**FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- I. Respondent is a Paramedic licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island under Emergency Medical Technician License Number EMT 14104.
2. On May 2, 2022, while employed as an Exeter Fire District Division of Emergency Medical Services Paramedic responding to an emergency medical services call, Respondent failed to adhere to the *Rhode Island Statewide Emergency Medical Services Protocols*.
3. The conduct described above constitutes unprofessional conduct pursuant to R.I. Gen. Law§ 23-4.1-9.
4. Said conduct was not willful or habitual.
5. Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of RIDOH.
6. Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands this Consent Order shall become binding once signed by Respondent and RIDOH.
7. Respondent understands the purpose of this Consent Order is solely to resolve Complaint C22-0614.

8. Respondent acknowledges and waives:

- a. The right to have an administrative hearing on this matter;
- b. The right to represent herself or be represented by an attorney of her own choosing at said
- b. The right to present testimony, evidence and witnesses on her behalf;
- c. The right to cross-examine witnesses presented by RIDOH;
- d. The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
- e. The right to take an appeal from the terms of this Consent Order; and
- g) Any objection that this Consent Order will (i) be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank, (ii) become a permanent part of Respondent's record maintained by RIDOH and a part of the public record of this proceeding or (iii) be posted on RIDOH's public website.

**ACCORDINGLY, AND BASED ON THE FOREGOING**

Respondent agrees to a voluntary surrender of her EMT license as of the effective date of this Consent Order. The effective date is the date on which this Consent Order is approved by RIDOH. Respondent may reapply for an EMT license five years after the effective date of this Consent Order.


