**CONSENT ORDER**

The Rhode Island Board of Medical Licensure and Discipline (“Board”) has reviewed and investigated the above-referenced complaint pertaining to Dr. Ho Dzung Anh (“Respondent”) through its Investigative Committee. The Board makes the following

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Respondent was a licensed physician in the State of Rhode Island from July 12, 2016 through June 30, 2018, and was licensed in Rhode Island at the time of all conduct alleged herein. Respondent graduated from University of Virginia School of Medicine on May 17, 2009.
2. The Board opened complaint 200469 upon receipt of a March 4, 2020 Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order from the Medical Board of California (collectively, the “California Order”).
3. The Investigative Committee determined that the Respondent was licensed at the time of the clinical services that served as the basis for the California Order.
4. Based on review of the California Order, the Investigative Committee determined that Respondent violated R.I. Gen. Laws § 5-37-5.1 (21), which defines “unprofessional conduct” as including, “[s]urrender, revocation, suspension, limitation of privilege based on quality of care

*provided, or any other disciplinary action against a license or authorization to practice medicine in another state or jurisdiction.”*


**Based on the foregoing, the parties agree as follows:**

1. Respondent admits to and agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Board.
2. Respondent has agreed to this Consent Order and understands that it is subject to final approval of the Board and is not binding on Respondent until final ratification by the Board.
3. If ratified by the Board, Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
  - a. The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
  - b. The right to produce witnesses and evidence on his behalf at a hearing;
  - c. The right to cross examine witnesses;
  - d. The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;
  - e. The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
  - f. Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order;
  - g. Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review; and
  - h. Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank and Federation of State Medical Boards and posted to the Rhode Island Department of Health (“RIDOH”) public website.
4. Board file number C18-0162B dated March 5, 2020 is hereby closed with no further action and there are no other matters before the Board pertaining to Respondent.
5. Respondent agrees to pay, within five days of the ratification of this Consent Order, an administrative fee of \$2936.00 for costs associated with investigating the above-referenced complaint. Such payment shall be made by certified check, made payable to “**Rhode Island**

**General Treasurer,”** and sent to Rhode Island Department of Health, 3 Capitol Hill, Room 205, Providence, RI 02908, Attn: Lauren Lasso. Respondent shall send notice of compliance with this condition to [DOH.PRCCompliance@health.ri.gov](mailto:DOH.PRCCompliance@health.ri.gov) within 30 days of submitting payment.

6. In the event that Respondent applies for a new license to practice medicine in Rhode Island, Respondent shall and hereby agrees to include a copy of this reprimand in such Rhode Island application for a physician license.
