**CONSENT ORDER**

Pursuant to R.I.G.L. 23-17-9-8 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated there under, the Rhode Island Department of Health (hereinafter the "Department"), and the Advisory Board for Nursing Assistants (hereinafter the "Board"), has investigated a complaint charging AMANDA MARIE DEARTH, NA42190 (hereinafter the "Respondent") with a violation of RIGL 23-17-9-8. After review and consideration by the Department and the Board with respect to the allegations of unprofessional conduct of the Respondent, the following are and shall constitute

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Respondent is a Nursing Assistant licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island under Nursing Assistant License Number, NA42190.
2. At all times relevant hereto, Respondent was employed by Friendly Home Inc., Woonsocket, RI.
3. That on or about January 18, 2014, Respondent stole a resident's engagement ring and wedding band and sold it to The Gold Exchange in Woonsocket, RI. Respondent was arrested by Woonsocket Police and charged with a Felony for Larceny > \$1,500 and a Misdemeanor for Obtaining Money Under False Pretense. Respondent admitted such activity.
4. That the conduct described in paragraph three (3) herein constitutes unprofessional conduct pursuant to Section 23-17-9-8 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated there under.
5. That the Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Department and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Department.

3. Respondent must first meet all education requirements for licensure in effect if and when Respondent reapplies for licensure.
4. That this Order shall become part of a public record of this proceeding.

  7. That the Respondent understands the purpose of this Consent Order is solely to resolve the complaint of unprofessional conduct alleged against the Respondent.
