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# Rhode Island Substance Use Treatment and Recovery Resources

Rhode Island offers a variety of behavioral health resources and services for people experiencing mental health and/or substance use conditions.

Healthcare professionals are encouraged to use this resource guide to refer patients and/or clients of all ages (from children to adults) to services ranging from immediate crisis management and harm reduction to treatment and recovery support services.

## For immediate crisis services and support:

### 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline

Patients, clients, or their loved ones who are experiencing a substance use crisis, emotional distress, or thoughts of suicide can call or text **988** or chat with **988** at [988lifeline.org](https://988lifeline.org) to connect with a trained crisis counselor for support.

### BH Link Triage Center

For patients age 18 and older, call or text **988** or chat at [988lifeline.org/chat](https://988lifeline.org/chat) to reach BH Link.

The BH Link Triage Center, located at **975 Waterman Ave., East Providence, Rhode Island**, is a 24/7 community-based, walk-in/drop-off facility providing services for mental health and substance use crisis assessments and assistance with treatment referrals.

### Rhode Island Buprenorphine Hotline

This 24/7 hotline, **401-606-5456**, connects people with moderate to severe opioid use disorder to immediate telehealth services for the initiation of buprenorphine treatment.

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## Safe Stations (24/7):

### Providence Safe Stations

Available 24-hours a day, seven days a week. You can visit any of [Providence's 12 fire stations](#), speak with the trained staff on duty, and immediately get connected to treatment support and services. Providence Safe Stations is free and provides a welcoming environment for when you're ready for recovery.

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## For patients seeking detoxification services:

Detoxification treatment centers are inpatient facilities where patients can stay for five to seven days and receive supervision for medically managed withdrawal, also commonly referred to as detoxification. This may include medication to ease the discomfort of withdrawal symptoms. Anti-craving medications and medications to treat substance use disorders (e.g., buprenorphine or methadone for opioid use disorder) may also be utilized. It is important to note that currently, Butler Hospital is the only detoxification treatment center in Rhode Island that will accept pregnant individuals.

## For inpatient rehabilitation (residential services):

An inpatient rehabilitation facility is where a person goes during the early stages of recovery after completing detoxification. This means that the patient is no longer experiencing withdrawal and may be taking medications to reduce cravings and treat substance use disorders. Patients can stay for up to 28 days with others starting their recovery journey. During their stay, patients participate in intensive group therapy, individual therapy, and other activities focused on building skills and confidence to maintain recovery.

## **For patients in early recovery and needing support from a recovery residence:**

A “recovery residence” (RR) is a broad term describing a sober, safe, and healthy living environment that promotes recovery from alcohol and/or substance misuse and associated issues. The purpose of a recovery residence is to provide a safe and healthy living environment, as well as improve one’s physical, mental, spiritual, and social wellbeing.

Recovery residences are divided into different levels of support. The levels are based on the type, as well as the intensity and duration, of support the residence offers. Services span from peer-to-peer recovery support (all recovery residences) to medical and counseling services (at recovery residences offering higher levels of support).

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## **State-Funded Financial Support for Recovery Housing: 1-Year Grant**

To receive the [1-Year Grant](#), an individual’s eligibility must be reassessed every 90 days for up to 365 days. House managers or operators of recovery houses complete the reassessment.

Reimbursement will be at \$25/day for National Alliance for Recovery Residences (NARR) Level II recovery housing on a tiered system:

- Days 1-90: State pays 100% (\$25 per day); Resident pays \$0
  - Days 91-180: State pays 80% (\$20 per day); Resident pays 20% (\$5 per day)
  - Days 181-365: State pays 60% (\$15 per day); Resident pays 40% (\$10 per day)

### Harm Reduction Vending Machines

ACOS harm reduction vending machines provide free, safer use supplies 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The vending machines are currently stocked with fentanyl test strip kits, hygiene kits, naloxone (Narcan®), safer injection kits, safer sex kits, referral cards, and wound care kits. The ENCORE mobile outreach team delivers free sterile needles, safer sex kits, HIV-testing information, and toiletries throughout the state. The mobile outreach team also offers counseling, [HIV prevention and education](#), and referrals to substance use treatment and medical care facilities.

PWR provides syringe exchange services at the main drop-in center and through their mobile outreach team. The street outreach team offers free HIV and Hepatitis C testing, sterile syringes, fentanyl test strips, naloxone, condoms, and other supplies. Additionally, PWR provides peer recovery coaching and can help connect individuals with a treatment program if they are ready for one.
